

## School of Physics and Astronomy Course Feedback Summary

Course: Astrophysics 3

During the course the student will receive the following feedback on their work:

A (non-assessed) hand-in question is associated with each tutorial sheet in both semesters of the course. Students who complete these will be given personalised feedback from the lecturer on their performances on these questions, both written on the scripts and orally during the tutorials. This feedback will be returned within two weeks. If the question is handed in at or before a Friday lecture, it will normally be examined and returned for Monday's tutorial.

Students will additionally receive personal feedback on their other tutorial work during workshop hours, from the lecturer and/or teaching assistants. Written solutions to tutorial questions will also be provided on-line (usually 2-4 weeks after the tutorial).

Students will also receive in-lecture instant feedback through interactive worked examples and discussion questions.

After the course the student will receive the following feedback on their work:

After the Board of Examiners a summary of the cohort performance in the written examination will be published on the School website. This will include the course's pass rate, mark average, standard deviation, and analysis of how different questions were answered and any major misconceptions found. This summary will be retained on the School website archive and will be available to future cohorts as a learning resource for use in conjunction with the past papers available on-line from the library web site.

Students may view their own marked examination script by at the Teaching Office. This must be arranged by appointment with the Teaching Administrator.
