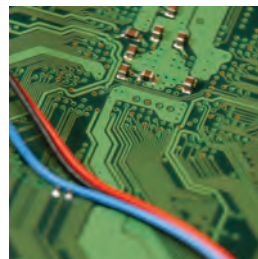
What's in it for Research Facilities?
